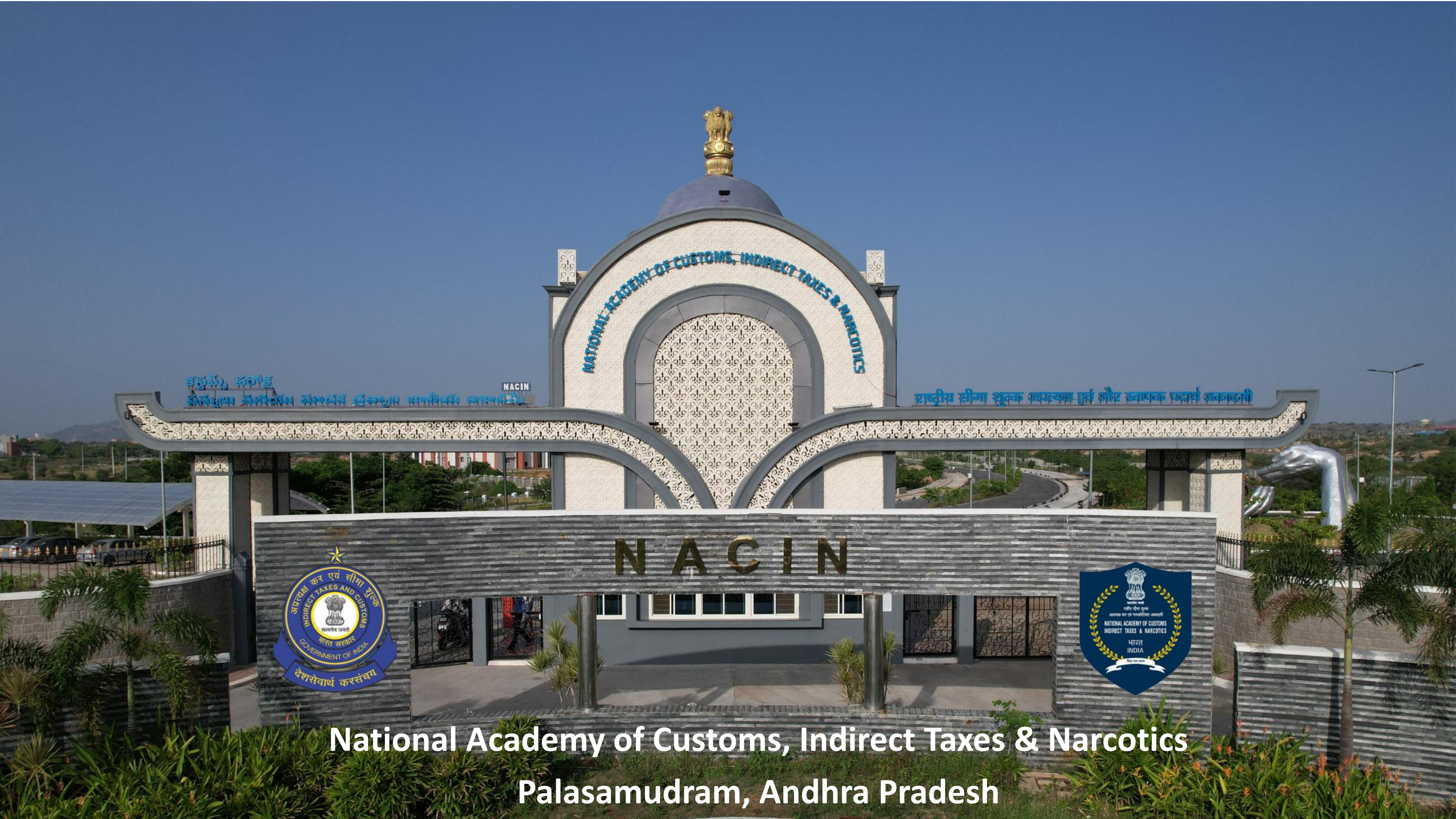

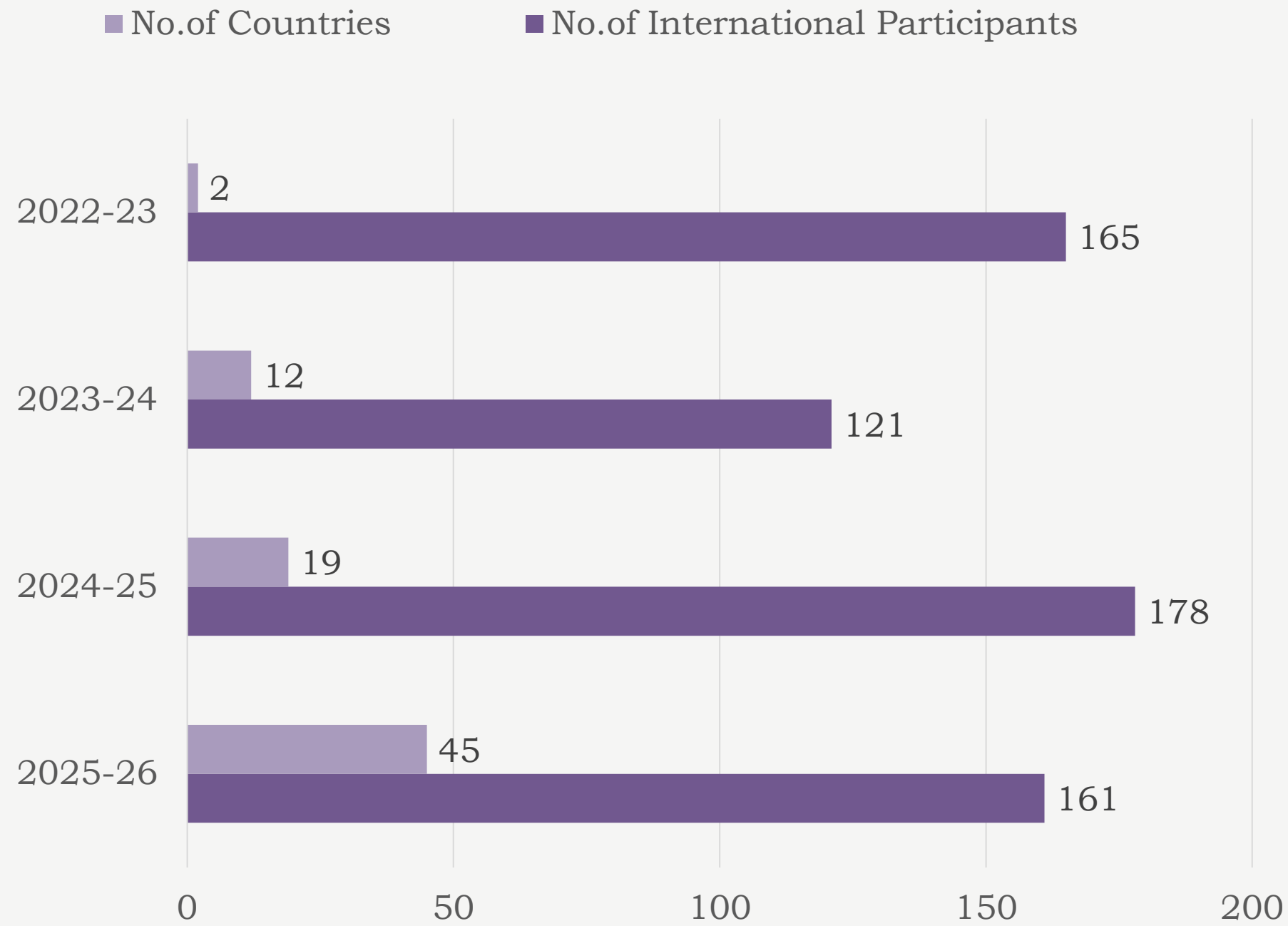

Expanding Regional Diversity (Gol Funded)



2022-23

- Under ITEC, Participants came from only 2 countries and none in non-ITEC programs

2023-24

- Under ITEC, Participants came from 9 countries and from 18 in non-ITEC programs

2024-25

- Under ITEC, Participants came from 3 countries and from 19 in non-ITEC programs.

2025-26 and way forward

- In 2025-26, we have **trained 147 participants from 42 countries under ITEC** and from 3 countries in Non-ITEC programs. We aim to conduct trainings for over 250 international participants including both ITEC and Non-ITEC in the upcoming year.



International Trainings Conducted



- Funded by the MEA for foreign participants
- From on-demand bilateral courses → to open, global offerings listed on MEA website
- Launch of a structured ITEC calendar from 2025

Strategic Partnerships: Regional CB Hub

Strategic shift from:

- Isolated trainings for Indian participants
→ NACIN as delivery partner for regional events
- Partners now treat NACIN as a long-term platform, not a one-time venue

New partnerships forged or underway:

- UK HMRC, US CBP, South Korea

- **UNODA, ABF, UK HMRC, US CBP, WCO:**
All intend to deliver regional trainings at NACIN, not just national.

Recently concluded ITEC training program on “Countering Illegal Drug Trafficking” for **42 officers from 20 countries** (including India) from Africa, Asia and Middle East, with the motto: Together, we learn. Together, we act, for tackling drug trafficking through international cooperation.

Training Programs – WCO- INAMA India and South Asia Project



- ❖ Capacity Building Activities for “Combating Illegal Wildlife Trafficking” in collaboration with WCO under WCO-INAMA India and South Asia Project.
- ❖ **05 Training programs** were conducted during 2024-25 and 2025-26 till August, 2025 – Training more than 100 officers from Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bhutan and India.
- ❖ **21 officers** (05 each from Sri Lanka, Nepal and Bhutan and 06 (six) officers from CBIC) have been trained as Trainers (ToT) to share their knowledge to train more officers in combating illegal wildlife trafficking.
- ❖ Recently concluded Inter-agency Cooperation workshop involving different organizations of India viz., CBIC, WCCB, Animal Quarantine, Plant Quarantine, State Forest Departments, Indian Coast Guard, Border Security Force and Sahastra Seema Bal (SSB), is a milestone bringing different agencies together on a single platform to combat the menace of Illegal Wildlife Trafficking.
